

**THE BAR-ROOM BUZZARDS + 2
AT FLOWER CITY JAZZ SOCIETY
GREEN LANTERN INN,
MONDAY, JUNE 15TH AT 6:30PM**

The Bar-Room Buzzards are celebrating their 42nd year anniversary in 2009. The band was formed in 1967 at the Speakeasy Restaurant in Niagara Falls, and, after a tenure that lasted for three years, they opened the famous Showboat in Buffalo in January of 1971. The band appeared as a fixture in the Boiler-Room Lounge and on the Promenade Deck during its four-year mooring at the foot of Hertel Avenue. Their summer activity has included performances on the Niagara Clipper and the Miss Buffalo Cruise Lines along with concerts at various suburban outdoor stage areas. The band has also performed at jazz festivals in New Orleans, San Diego, Columbus, Ohio, and Indianapolis, Indiana as well as Jazz organization events throughout NY State. A highlight of their long history would be their association as house band on the nationally televised Mark Russell Comedy Specials aired on Public TV. This relationship lasted for over 26 years.

The members of the band include:

Paul Preston on clarinet and soprano saxophone. Paul has a professional career that has exceeded 50 years and began in 1954 when he was discharged from the US Army. In 1954 Paul and Jim Koterak began performing side-by-side continuing into 2005. Paul and Jim formed the Bar-Room Buzzards in 1966.

Lew Custode on trumpet and vocals. Lew started playing traditional jazz at an early age. As an accomplished musician, he has performed with a wide variety of music ensembles including rock bands, jazz and commercial dance groups, big bands and more. Lew's love of traditional jazz has been described as nothing less than contagious.

Warren Stirtzinger on guitar and banjo. Warren is the "Canadian contingent" of the band and joined the Buzzards in 1999. He hails from St. Catharines, Ontario, where he has been a full-time musician since graduating from Brock University in 1977. He has worked in a variety of music groups in the Niagara area.

Paul Zapalowski on bass. Paul is an artist skilled in many different types of music. From symphonic to dixieland, from jazz to big band, "Zap" is a favorite with audiences as well as fellow musicians. In addition to his busy performance schedule, Paul currently teaches both classical and jazz bass methods at Buffalo State College.
