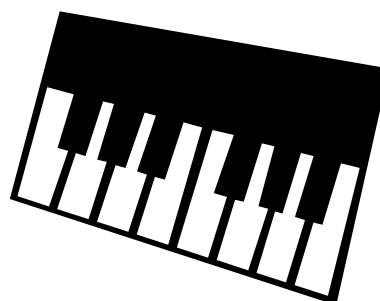


WELCOME BACK JOE CAVALLARO'S DIXIELAND JAZZ BAND AT FLOWER CITY JAZZ SOCIETY

Joe Cavallaro's Dixieland Jazz Band is from the Southern Tier, in Elmira, NY. The band came into being a little over 26 years ago at Bernie Murray's, a small club on the southside of Elmira. Some will remember the band celebrated their 26th anniversary recently with a six-hour session at Lib's Supper Club in Elmira, playing to a packed house. Their popularity has continued to grow with an earlier record album and four CD's. Their latest CD was recorded live at Elmira's Clemens Center for their 25th Silver Anniversary. Over the years, Joe's band has performed at the Clemens Center but more important than that they have shared the billing and performed as the curtain raisers at the Clemens Center for such stars as Al Hirt, Roy Clark, Harry Belafonte and Sam Butera. They have performed at the Finger Lakes Jazz Festival in Hector, Goose Watch Winery, Pine Tree Resort in Alexandria Bay, The Flower City Jazz Society in Rochester, The Queen City Jazz Society in Buffalo, The Queenston Jazz Festival in Canada and also had the honor of playing at the Inaugural for Gov. WEBSITE

Our website is finally at a point where we can start to use it as a communications tool for our members. The intent of the site is to hopefully begin to cut our mailing costs for the newsletter and renewal mailings. (Costs for postage are probably going to continue to increase almost every year.) However, this is a voluntary program and in fact not all members can use the site for its true purpose (besides as an advertisement for FCJS). What we would like to accomplish with the website is have you go to the site and print out your own newsletter and renewal form when notified that these items are available. We intend to start slowly by simply announcing to all of you who have e-mail addresses, that the newsletter is available on the website. We will send along the URL (website address hyperlink) so that you can just click on the address and it will take you to the site. Once there, you can print the newsletter if you so desire or just those parts that you want. (If you want to make a reservation for dinner, you will have to print that page and then cut out the dinner reservation form to send to Mickey.) We will do this for a few months and then we will send out a note inquiring if you would like to be taken off the hardcopy newsletter list and just get the electronic version. Once members get use to the electronic route, we will introduce the renewal form into the system for all of you who would like to get your form in that manner. Remember, use of the electronic pathway is not mandatory just because you have an e-mail address. It will be up to you to decide. Hopefully many of you will choose the electronic version so that we can start cutting our mail costs by 2010.

HATS FOR HEROES

Help us support our troops. Mickey Collier has obtained a knitting pattern for "Hats for Heroes". We are asking those who knit to help us make these hats. The pattern will be available at the July concert on the table with the name tags. Even if you do not knit, you can help by donating some yarn for someone who does. When purchasing the yarn, wool yarn must be used as it is the warmest. The headgear the military issues is made of synthetic fiber which is not as warm as wool. In addition, acrylic yarn could melt if a soldier is injured. Colors allowed by the military are black, charcoal, brown, tan and olive drab, with black being the preferred color. Mickey was able to buy a yarn called "Patton's (looked like camouflage and had all of the above colors) at Joann Fabrics for roughly \$6.99 a skein and it was on sale for \$4.00.
